ID:- AYU0635) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course along with condition under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sri Sri College of Ayurvedic Science and Research Hospital, Sri Sri University, Bidyadharpur, Arilo, Ward No.3, Cuttack-754006, Odisha (Inst. ID:- AYU0635)** inspection was conducted on **24.03.2025 and 25.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report shortcomings/defects were observed.**
- 3) The assessment report was placed in the **121st Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **25.04.2025** On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **06.05.2025** to appear on **09.05.2025** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission to your college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.**
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated in the hearing letter. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. No. SSCASRH/SSU/323-2025 dated 07.05.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives **Dr. Pradeep Panda, Dean Superintendent, Principal of the college** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **09.05.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Shortcoming still persists. However as per MESAR-2024 only 02 pharmacists are required hence, no shortcoming persists.

7. Radiologist:- Recruitment is in process and, will be completed before session start. Undertaking enclosed.

8. Pharmacognosist:- Recruitment process initiated. Commitment to fill before session start is given.

(6 to 8) Shortcoming persists but as per MESAR-2024 they are not required.

2. Functionality of the hospital:-

2. Functionality of the hospital:-

2.a) Screening OPD is functional. On 22.03.2025. The OPD was operational and, visited by the NCISM inspection team on dated 22-March-2025, Dr. Dibya Ranjan Sahoo (RMO) was on duty and Evidence includes photos, and video clips attached.

2.b) OPD & IPD of PTSR department are functional. Regular antenatal and prenatal consultations are provided, Under Janani Suraksba Yojana (JSY), free care and financial assistance are offered. Scheme documentation is enclosed.

5) The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **122nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 14.05.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 along with a condition for fulfillment of hospital staff and instruments as per the MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024.**

"DECISION"

6) **Therefore, Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to Sri Sri College of Ayurvedic Science and Research Hospital, Sri Sri University, Bidyadharpur, Arilo, Ward No. 3, Cuttack-754006, Odisha (Inst. ID:- AYU0635) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -**

- I. Minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **In accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) **The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 4 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 11) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
